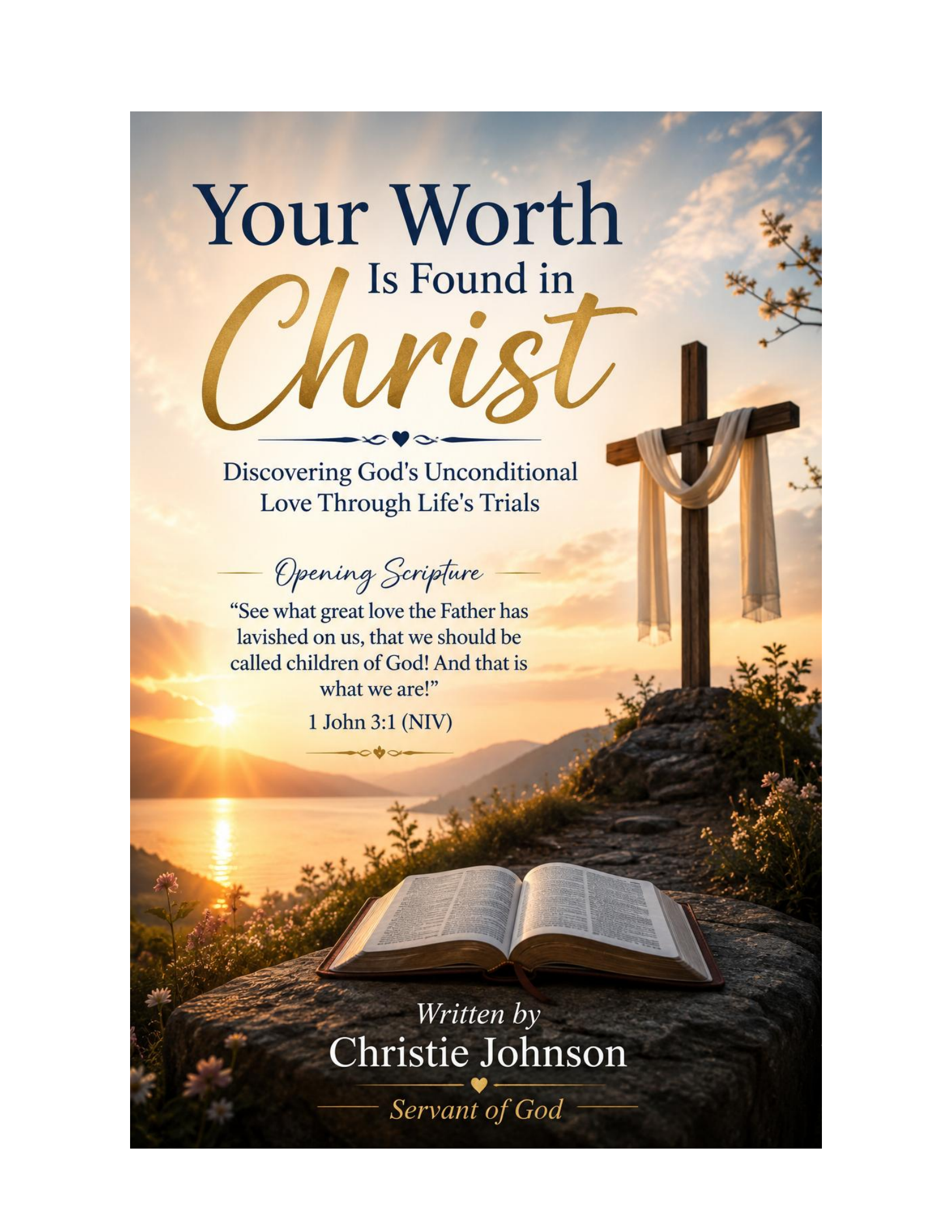

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Introduction

In this paper, you will discover why your worth is not determined by your past, your failures, or the opinions of others, but by your identity in Jesus Christ.

Before we begin, I invite you to pause and consider this truth: if you have placed your faith in Jesus Christ, your identity is no longer defined by what has happened to you or what others have said about you.

You belong to God. You are His beloved child.

The world often measures value by success, appearance, approval, relationships, or accomplishments. God's Word teaches something far greater. Our worth is not earned by performance; it is rooted in the love of God and revealed most clearly through Jesus Christ.

For much of my life, I searched for the acceptance and unconditional love I longed to receive. Like many others, I believed that if I worked harder, loved deeper, or met everyone's expectations, I would finally feel valued. Yet no amount of striving could fill the emptiness that only God could satisfy.

Through seasons of rejection, grief, disappointment, and loss, the Lord patiently taught me a life-changing truth: my worth has never been determined by how others see me, but by how He sees me. This lesson did not come quickly. It was shaped through brokenness, difficult relationships, personal loss, and many moments when I cried out to God with questions about my identity, purpose, and value.

Yet through every season, God remained faithful. His Word reminded me that I am loved, chosen, forgiven, redeemed, and secure in Jesus Christ. While old wounds may still try to speak, God's truth has become the louder voice.

This paper is both a testimony of God's faithfulness and a study of what Scripture teaches about our identity and worth. My prayer is that as you read, the Holy Spirit will replace every lie with God's truth, every fear with His peace, and every doubt with the assurance that your worth is found in Christ alone.

Your value is not determined by your past, your failures, the opinions of others, or the trials you have endured. Your worth is found in the God who created you, redeemed you through Jesus Christ, and calls you His beloved child.

When we understand His unconditional love, we begin to live in the freedom, hope, and purpose He intended from the beginning.



My Journey to Discovering My Worth in Christ

For much of my life, I believed my value depended on how others treated me. I longed to be accepted, loved, and encouraged by those closest to me. Although my physical needs were provided for, I often felt love had to be earned rather than freely given. Acceptance seemed to depend on meeting expectations, avoiding mistakes, and putting others before myself.

Those experiences shaped the way I viewed myself. Instead of seeing myself through God's eyes, I began seeing myself through rejection. I questioned my purpose, doubted my worth, and wondered if I would ever truly belong. Looking back, I realize I had allowed people to define an identity only God had the authority to give.

As the years passed, life brought deeper challenges. Difficult relationships, personal loss, declining health, and caring for my husband during his final illness left me physically, emotionally, and spiritually exhausted. There were moments when I felt that no matter how much I gave, it would never be enough. Criticism often overshadowed sacrifice, and discouragement threatened to silence hope.

Yet even in those darkest seasons, God never abandoned me.

When I felt forgotten, He reminded me that He would never leave nor forsake me (*Heb. 13:5*). When I had nothing left to give, His strength carried me. When rejection grew loud, His Word reminded me that I was His beloved child, created in His image and redeemed by His Son.

Slowly, God began changing the way I thought. Instead of asking, "Why don't people love me the way I long to be loved?" He taught me to ask, "Will you believe what I say about you?" That question changed everything. I began to understand that no person could give me the identity I was searching for. Only the One who created me could define my worth.

My acceptance was never meant to rest on people's approval but on the unchanging love of God revealed through Jesus Christ.

The journey has not been without struggles. Old wounds still try to whisper familiar lies, but those lies no longer have the final word. God's truth does. Today, I share my story not to magnify my pain but to magnify God's faithfulness. If He could transform my heart and teach me to find my identity in Christ, He can do the same for anyone willing to trust Him.



What God's Word Teaches About Our Worth

One of the greatest deceptions of the enemy is convincing people that their worth is determined by their failures, their past, or the opinions of others.

From the beginning, Satan has sought to distort God's truth about our identity. Scripture, however, reveals that our value has never been based on our performance but on the God who created us and the price He paid to redeem us.

The Bible teaches that every person is created in the image of God (*Genesis 1:26–27*). Because of this, every human life has dignity, value, and purpose. Although sin has broken our relationship with God, it has never erased the value He places on those He created. While all have sinned and fall short of God's glory (*Romans 3:23*), God's love has never depended on our perfection. *Romans 5:8* reminds us that Christ died for us while we were still sinners, demonstrating the depth of God's unconditional love.

Through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, everyone who places their faith in Him is forgiven, redeemed, adopted into God's family, and given a new identity.

Scripture calls believers' children of God (*1 John 3:1*), a chosen people (*1 Peter 2:9*), a new creation (*2 Corinthians 5:17*), and God's workmanship, created for His purposes (*Ephesians 2:10*). These truths define who we are far more than our past or our circumstances ever could.

Understanding our identity in Christ transforms the way we live.

When our worth is rooted in God's unchanging character instead of the approval of others, we are no longer controlled by rejection, criticism, or fear. We become free to love others, forgive as we have been forgiven, and walk confidently in the purpose God has prepared for us.

This transformation is a lifelong journey. As we surrender to Christ and continually renew our minds through His Word (*Romans 12:2*), the Holy Spirit replaces lies with truth and teaches us to see ourselves as God sees us—deeply loved, fully forgiven, and eternally secure in Him.

Instead of striving to earn acceptance, we learn to rest in His grace. Instead of allowing our past to define us, we allow God's promises to shape our future. This is the freedom that comes from knowing our worth has always been, and always will be, found in Christ alone.



Living This Truth

Discovering that your worth is found in Christ is not simply a truth to understand—it is a truth to live each day.

For many years, I knew the verses that spoke about God's love, yet I struggled to believe they applied to me. My mind often returned to the voices of rejection instead of the voice of my Heavenly Father. Over time, God patiently showed me that true spiritual transformation happens as we surrender our hearts to Him and allow His Word to renew the way we think.

Learning to live from my identity in Christ has been a daily journey.

There are still moments when painful memories surface or when I am tempted to measure my value by the opinions of others. In those moments, I return to Scripture and choose to believe what God says rather than the lies of my past.

As I trust His promises, He replaces fear with peace, discouragement with hope, and insecurity with confidence in His love.

Living in this truth also changes the way we relate to others. When our identity is secure in Christ, we no longer seek acceptance or approval to determine our worth. Instead, we are free to love others, forgive as we have been forgiven, and serve with humility because our confidence rests in Jesus rather than in people.

This transformation requires intentional spiritual formation.

As we spend time in God's Word, pray, worship, and remain connected with other believers, the Holy Spirit continues His work of making us more like Christ. He teaches us to exchange fear for faith, shame for grace, and hopelessness for the living hope found in Jesus. I have learned that healing is not the absence of painful memories but the presence of God's faithfulness during them. My past is now part of my testimony, but it no longer defines my identity. Christ does.

If you struggle to believe you are loved, accepted, or valuable, begin each day by opening God's Word before listening to the voices of the world. Read His promises, pray over them, and allow Him to renew your mind. As you walk with Him daily, you will begin to see yourself through His eyes rather than through the lens of your past. You will discover, as I have, that true freedom is found in knowing your worth is securely rooted in Jesus Christ.



Who God Says You Are in Christ

One of the greatest ways to overcome the lies of the enemy is to replace them with the truth of God's Word. Feelings change, circumstances change, and the opinions of people often change, but God's truth never changes. When you place your faith in Jesus Christ, your identity is no longer rooted in your past, your failures, or the labels others have placed upon you. Your identity is found in Him.

The following Scriptures provide a starting point for understanding who God says you are. As you read each passage, take time to thank God for these truths and ask the Holy Spirit to help you believe and live them each day.

Because of Jesus Christ, I Am...	Scripture	What This Means
A child of God	John 1:12; 1 John 3:1	God has adopted you into His family, and you belong to Him forever.
Loved by God	Romans 5:8; John 3:16	God's love is unconditional and demonstrated through Jesus Christ.
Forgiven	Ephesians 1:7; Colossians 2:13–14	Every sin has been paid for through the blood of Christ.
A new creation	2 Corinthians 5:17	Your old life no longer defines you. Christ has made you new.
Chosen	1 Peter 2:9; Ephesians 1:4	God intentionally called you to belong to Him and to declare His goodness.
Redeemed	Colossians 1:13–14; Titus 2:14	Jesus paid the price to rescue you from the power of sin.
Accepted in Christ	Ephesians 1:6	Your acceptance comes from God's grace, not your performance.
God's workmanship	Ephesians 2:10	God created you with purpose and prepared good works for you to accomplish.

Never alone	Hebrews 13:5; Matthew 28:20	Jesus promises never to leave or abandon His people.
More than a conqueror	Romans 8:37	Through Christ, you have victory over sin, fear, and discouragement.

The temple of the Holy Spirit	1 Corinthians 6:19–20	God's Spirit lives within every believer, empowering and transforming them.
God's friend	John 15:15	Jesus invites you into a personal relationship with Him.
A citizen of heaven	Philippians 3:20	Your eternal home is with Christ, and your hope is secure.
An heir with Christ	Romans 8:16–17	As God's child, you share in the inheritance He has promised His people.
Secure in God's love	Romans 8:38–39	Nothing can separate you from the love of God in Christ Jesus.

Replacing Lies with God's Truth

Whenever you are tempted to believe that you are unloved, unwanted, unworthy, or forgotten, pause and ask yourself one question:

"Am I believing what the world says about me, or what God says about me?"

Then open God's Word and replace the lie with His truth.

Instead of saying...

- "I am not good enough," remember: **I am God's workmanship (Ephesians 2:10).**
- "No one loves me," remember: **I am deeply loved by God (Romans 5:8).**
- "My past defines me," remember: **I am a new creation in Christ (2 Corinthians 5:17).**
- "I will always be alone," remember: **Jesus will never leave nor forsake me (Hebrews 13:5).**
- "I have no purpose," remember: **God created me for good works that He prepared in advance (Ephesians 2:10).**
- "I am beyond forgiveness," remember: **I have been completely forgiven through Jesus Christ (Ephesians 1:7).**

God's truth is stronger than every lie the enemy whispers and every label the world has placed upon you. As you continue spending time in Scripture, allow these truths to renew your mind, strengthen your faith, and remind you each day that your worth is securely rooted in Jesus Christ—not in your past, your performance, or the opinions of others.



How This Truth Shaped My Ministry Calling

As I look back over my life, I can see that God was doing far more than healing my heart—He was preparing me for the ministry He had already planned.

The seasons of rejection, grief, disappointment, and loss became the places where I learned to trust His faithfulness, depend on His grace, and discover that my identity was securely rooted in Christ. One of the greatest burdens God has placed on my heart is for people who feel broken, forgotten, rejected, or unworthy.

I know what it is like to search for acceptance in people, only to discover that no human relationship can provide the identity only God can give. Through His Word, the Holy Spirit transformed my thinking and taught me that lasting healing begins when we believe what God says about us. This conviction has become the foundation of the ministry God has called me to pursue. My desire is to point people to the hope, healing, and transformation found in Jesus Christ through biblical teaching, compassionate discipleship, personal testimony, and spiritual formation.

I want others to know they are deeply loved by God, created in His image, redeemed through Jesus Christ, and equipped by the Holy Spirit to live with confidence, purpose, and hope.

Everything God has entrusted to me—my testimony, education, doctoral studies, writing, Bible studies, and ministry—serves one purpose: to help people know Jesus more deeply and experience the freedom that comes from understanding their identity in Him. I have learned that God rarely wastes our pain. He often uses it to prepare us to encourage others to walk through similar valleys. The wounds that once caused me to question my worth have become reminders of God's faithfulness and opportunities to testify to His grace. What the enemy intended for harm, God has redeemed for His glory and for the good of those He has called me to serve.

If my journey helps even one person discover that his or her worth is found in Christ rather than in the approval of the world, then every difficult season will have served a greater purpose.

To God alone be the glory, for He heals the brokenhearted, restores the weary soul,
and makes all things new.
