Discovering God's Character Through Their Lives

Introduction

Throughout my walk with Jesus Christ, God has continually drawn me back to one simple yet life-changing truth: the more we know God, the more we are transformed into His likeness. Throughout my doctoral studies, personal Bible study, seasons of healing, and years of ministry preparation, I have discovered that Scripture is not simply a collection of historical events or remarkable people. It is the unfolding story of God's **faithfulness** and His plan to redeem humanity through Jesus Christ.

This series was born out of that discovery. As I studied the lives of the **faithful** women God chose to include in His Word, I realized that each one reveals something beautiful about His character. Their stories are not recorded merely so we will admire their **faith, courage, wisdom, or devotion**. They are recorded so that we will know the God they trusted. Through their lives we see **His promises, His mercy, His provision, His wisdom, His power, His grace, and His unwavering faithfulness**. Every one of these women points us to Jesus Christ, who perfectly fulfills every promise and every truth revealed throughout Scripture.

These women lived in different generations and faced quite different circumstances. Some waited many years for God to fulfill **His promises**. Some carried painful pasts. Some endured seasons of grief and uncertainty. Others were called to lead courageously or to act wisely in tricky situations. Some experienced remarkable restoration after encountering Jesus. Yet despite their differences, they all share one common testimony: God is **faithful** to those who trust Him.

As you journey through these studies, you will meet **Sarah, Rahab, Ruth, Lydia, Deborah, Esther, Lydia, Mary the mother of Jesus, Mary Magdalene, Martha and Mary of Bethany, the Samaritan woman, Lydia, and Priscilla**. Together, their stories reveal the beautiful progression of God's redemptive plan—from His **covenant promises** in the Old Testament to their fulfillment in Jesus Christ, and then to the lives of women whose hearts were transformed by the gospel and who **faithfully** served His Kingdom. Each woman reveals another facet of God's character and another invitation for us to become more like Christ.

My prayer is that you will not approach these studies as biographies to be admired from a distance. Instead, invite the Holy Spirit to walk beside you through each chapter. Allow Him to search your heart, strengthen your **faith**, correct your thinking, and reveal areas where He desires to continue His transforming work within you. Ask Him not only to teach you about these women but also to teach you about Himself.

As you read each study, remember that the goal is not simply to learn more about **faithful women**. The goal is to know God more deeply, to recognize how every story points to Jesus Christ, and to allow His truth to shape your own life. Every lesson builds upon the previous one until together they reveal the beautiful picture God has been painting throughout all of Scripture—a picture of **His faithful love** and His desire to transform ordinary people into devoted followers of Christ.

As you read each woman's story, spend time reflecting on these questions before moving to the next study.

- What does this woman's life reveal about God's character?
- What qualities did God honor and develop in her life?
- Where do I see similar struggles, fears, or opportunities in my own life?

- How does Jesus perfectly fulfill what I see in this woman's story?
- In what ways is the Holy Spirit calling me to become more like Christ?
- What practical step of faith or obedience is God asking me to take because of what I have learned?
- How can I reflect God's character more faithfully in my home, church, relationships, ministry, and community?

As you prayerfully answer these questions throughout the series, you will begin to see that God is not only telling their story—He is continuing to write yours.

OPENING SCRIPTURE

THEME

God equips and strengthens His people to serve Him together, using faithful disciples who teach the truth, encourage believers, and advance His kingdom through humble partnership and obedient ministry.

KEY TRUTH

Priscilla's life reminds us that God delights in using ordinary believers who are fully committed to His work. Alongside her husband, Aquila, she faithfully served the early church through hospitality, discipleship, and sound biblical teaching. Priscilla teaches us that effective ministry grows from a heart devoted to Christ, a willingness to serve others, and a commitment to helping people grow in the truth of God's Word.

GOD'S CHARACTER REVEALED

- **God is Wise**—He equips His people with the truth of His Word so they can faithfully teach and disciple others.
- **God is Relational**—He designed believers to serve together in unity, encouraging one another and strengthening His church.
- **God is Faithful**—He continually raises up faithful servants to preserve and proclaim the gospel from one generation to the next.
- **God is Gracious**—He patiently matures His people, using them to help others grow in their understanding of Jesus Christ.
- **God is Sovereign**—He orchestrates divine appointments and partnerships to accomplish His kingdom purposes.
- **God is Empowering**—He equips ordinary believers with spiritual gifts and opportunities to make an extraordinary impact for His glory.

CENTRAL LESSON

God delights in using believers who faithfully serve Him alongside others. Priscilla's life teaches us that ministry is most effective when it is rooted in humility, biblical truth, loving relationships, and a willingness to invest in the spiritual growth of others. As we

faithfully use the gifts God has given us, He multiplies our influence, strengthens His church, and advances His kingdom through lives surrendered to His service.



Priscilla's Story

Priscilla's story is found in Acts 18, Romans 16:3–5, 1 Corinthians 16:19, and 2 Timothy 4:19. She is introduced alongside her husband, Aquila, after they had been forced to leave Rome because of the emperor's command against the Jews. They settled in Corinth, where they met the apostle, Paul. Because they shared the same trade of tentmaking, Paul stayed and worked with them, and their relationship grew into a faithful ministry partnership.

Priscilla and Aquila became devoted servants of Christ and active helpers in the spread of the gospel. They traveled with Paul to Ephesus and continued serving the church there. When they heard Apollos speaking boldly in the synagogue, they recognized both his zeal and his need for fuller understanding. Rather than embarrassing him publicly, they took him aside and explained the way of God more accurately. Their gentle correction helped strengthen Apollos for greater ministry.

Priscilla's life shows the beauty of serving God faithfully with others. She used her home, her knowledge of Scripture, her partnership with Aquila, and her relationship with Paul to strengthen the early church. Her story reminds us that God uses faithful disciples who are willing to teach, encourage, host, serve, and invest in others for the sake of His kingdom.



Understanding Priscilla's World

Priscilla lived during the first century when the early church was spreading across the Roman world. She and Aquila had experienced displacement when they were forced to leave Rome, yet God used that difficult transition to place them in Corinth at the right time to meet Paul. What may have looked like loss and interruption became part of God's plan to connect them with a ministry that would impact many believers.

Priscilla and Aquila worked as tentmakers, a trade that allowed them to support themselves while also serving in ministry. In the early church, homes often became places of worship, teaching, fellowship, and prayer. Since believers did not yet have church buildings, faithful households played a significant role in strengthening Christian communities. Priscilla's home became a place where ministry could grow and where believers could gather.

Her world also reminds us that discipleship often happens through relationships. Priscilla did not serve from a place of fame or public recognition, but through faithful partnership, hospitality, and careful teaching. Her ministry to Apollos shows how God

can use mature believers to help others grow in truth, humility, and effectiveness. Priscilla's life teaches us that spiritual influence is not always loud or visible, but it is powerful when surrendered to God.



What Priscilla's Life Reveals About God

Priscilla's life reveals a God who uses faithful partnerships to advance His kingdom. God did not call her to serve alone, but placed her in meaningful ministry relationships with Aquila, Paul, Apollos, and the early church. Through these connections, God strengthened His people and spread the gospel. Her story reminds us that ministry is often built through shared faith, mutual encouragement, and obedience to God's calling.

Her life also reveals God's sovereignty over difficult circumstances. Being forced to leave Rome could have seemed like a painful setback, yet God used that move to bring Priscilla and Aquila into Paul's path. What appeared to be disruption became divine direction. God was faithfully ordering their steps, using even hardship to position them for kingdom purpose.

Most importantly, Priscilla reveals that God values humble, truth-filled service. She did not seek attention for herself, but faithfully helped others understand the way of God more accurately. Her life reminds us that God uses those who are willing to open their homes, share His Word, encourage His servants, and strengthen His church. When believers grow together in ministry, God is glorified, the church is built up, and the gospel continues to move forward.



Lessons We Learn from Priscilla's Life

Priscilla's life teaches us that God can use ordinary believers in extraordinary ways when they faithfully surrender themselves to His service. She did not seek recognition or prominence, yet she became an essential part of the early church through her willingness to serve, disciple others, and faithfully proclaim God's truth. Her life reminds us that effective ministry is not measured by popularity but by humble obedience and faithfulness to God's calling.

We also learn that spiritual growth flourishes through biblical discipleship and godly relationships. Priscilla and Aquila invested in the lives of others, helping believers grow in their understanding of God's Word with wisdom, humility, and grace. Their ministry to Apollos demonstrates that mature believers have a responsibility to lovingly encourage, teach, and strengthen others so they may serve Christ more effectively.

Most importantly, Priscilla reminds us that ministry is strengthened through faithful partnership. Together with Aquila, she opened her home, shared her gifts, and served

wherever God led them. Their example teaches us that when believers work together in unity, humility, and love, God multiplies their influence and uses their lives to build His church and advance His kingdom in ways far beyond what they could accomplish alone.



Priscilla's Life and My Journey

As I reflect on Priscilla's life, I am reminded that God often accomplishes His greatest work through quiet faithfulness rather than public recognition. Like Priscilla, I want to remain available for whatever opportunities God places before me, whether they involve teaching, encouraging, serving behind the scenes, or simply investing in the spiritual growth of others. While Priscilla faithfully instructed Apollos in the truth of God's Word, Jesus is the living Word who perfectly reveals the Father and leads His people into all truth. Every act of teaching, discipleship, and encouragement in the church points back to Christ, who patiently teaches His followers and transforms their hearts through His grace.

Throughout His earthly ministry, Jesus invested deeply in people. He spent time teaching His disciples, correcting them with love, preparing them for ministry, and equipping them to continue His mission after His resurrection. He demonstrated that true leadership is expressed through humble service, sacrificial love, and a willingness to pour into the lives of others. Priscilla reflected this same servant-hearted ministry as she faithfully helped others grow in their understanding of God's truth.

Priscilla's partnership with Aquila also reflects the unity Christ desires among His followers. Jesus prayed that His people would be one, working together in love so the world would know Him. 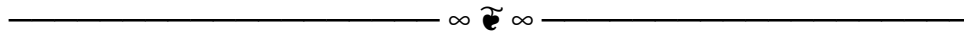
