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Inner Transformation Before Public Ministry

One of the most important lessons God has taught me is that He always works on the inner person before expanding the outward ministry.

When God calls someone into ministry, our natural tendency is to focus on what we will do for Him. We think about teaching, leading, writing, speaking, serving, or reaching others. Yet throughout Scripture, God repeatedly shows that before He uses a person publicly, He first works deeply within them privately.

God is not looking for talented people as much as He is looking for surrendered people.

Before Moses led Israel out of Egypt, God spent years preparing him in the wilderness (**Exodus 3:1–10**). Before David became king, God spent years shaping his character while he cared for sheep and fled from Saul (**1 Samuel 16–24**). Before the **Apostle Paul** began his missionary journeys, God took him into a season of preparation and growth (**Galatians 1:15–18**). Even Jesus spent years in preparation before beginning His public ministry (**Luke 3:23**).

God's pattern has not changed.

He works on the heart before He works through the hands.

For much of my life, I thought ministry was primarily about helping others. While that is certainly part of God's calling, I have come to realize that God first wanted to transform me. Long before He opened doors for ministry, He was teaching me lessons about surrender, obedience, trust, forgiveness, humility, and dependence upon Him. One of the foundational Scriptures that shaped my understanding of spiritual formation is:

"Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think."

Romans 12:2

Notice that God begins with transformation before service. He changes the mind, renews the heart, and reshapes the inner person before the outward work becomes effective.

This truth became even clearer through my studies in spiritual formation. I learned that God's primary goal is not simply to make us productive servants but to make us Christlike disciples. Ministry is not about performing for God; it is about becoming like Jesus.

The Apostle Paul described this process when he wrote,

*"My dear children, for whom I am again in the pains of childbirth until Christ is formed in you."
"Christ is formed in you"*

Galatians 4:19 (captures the heart of spiritual formation)

God is continually shaping His people into the image of His Son.

Before God entrusts us with greater influence, He often teaches us faithfulness in hidden places. Before He calls us to lead others, He teaches us how to follow Him. Before He gives us a public platform, He develops private character.

I have experienced this reality personally.

Many of the most significant lessons God has taught me did not come through ministry success but through seasons of pain, loss, disappointment, waiting, and surrender. During those seasons, He exposed areas of my life that still needed healing. He revealed fears I needed to release, wounds I needed to forgive, and attitudes that needed to become more like Christ.

At the time, I often wanted God to change my circumstances. Instead, He was changing me.

"When troubles of any kind come your way, consider it an opportunity for great joy. For you know that when your faith is tested, your endurance has a chance to grow. So let it grow, for when your endurance is fully developed, you will be perfect and complete, needing nothing."

James 1:2–4

Looking back, I can now see that some of God's greatest work happened during seasons when it felt like nothing was happening at all.

- While I was waiting for direction, He was developing trust.
- While I was struggling through hardship, He was building endurance.
- While I was asking Him to remove obstacles, He was teaching me dependence.
- While I was seeking opportunities to serve, He was teaching me what it truly meant to be His servant.

One of the dangers of public ministry is that it can become focused on activity rather than intimacy with God. It is possible to do many things for God while neglecting time with God. The Lord continually reminds me that effectiveness in ministry will never replace a close relationship with Him. Everything meaningful that flows from ministry must first flow from communion with Christ.

This understanding has shaped the way I view my calling today. My goal is not simply to teach people biblical information. My goal is to help people experience the transforming work of God in their own lives.

True transformation happens when God's truth moves beyond knowledge and begins changing our hearts, our relationships, our decisions, and our daily walk with Him.

That is why spiritual formation remains at the center of my ministry. Before we can effectively lead others, we must allow God to lead us. Before we can help others grow, we must continue growing ourselves. Before we can point others toward Christ, we must continually abide in Him.

- God is still working on me.
- He is still teaching me.
- He is still transforming me.

And I am grateful that He cares more about my character than my accomplishments.

The ministry God has called me to today is not the result of my own strength, education, or abilities. It is the result of years of God's patient work within me. Every lesson, every trial, every season of waiting, and every step of obedience has been part of His preparation.

As I continue serving Him, I never want to forget this truth:

The greatest ministry God will ever build is the one He builds within our hearts.
