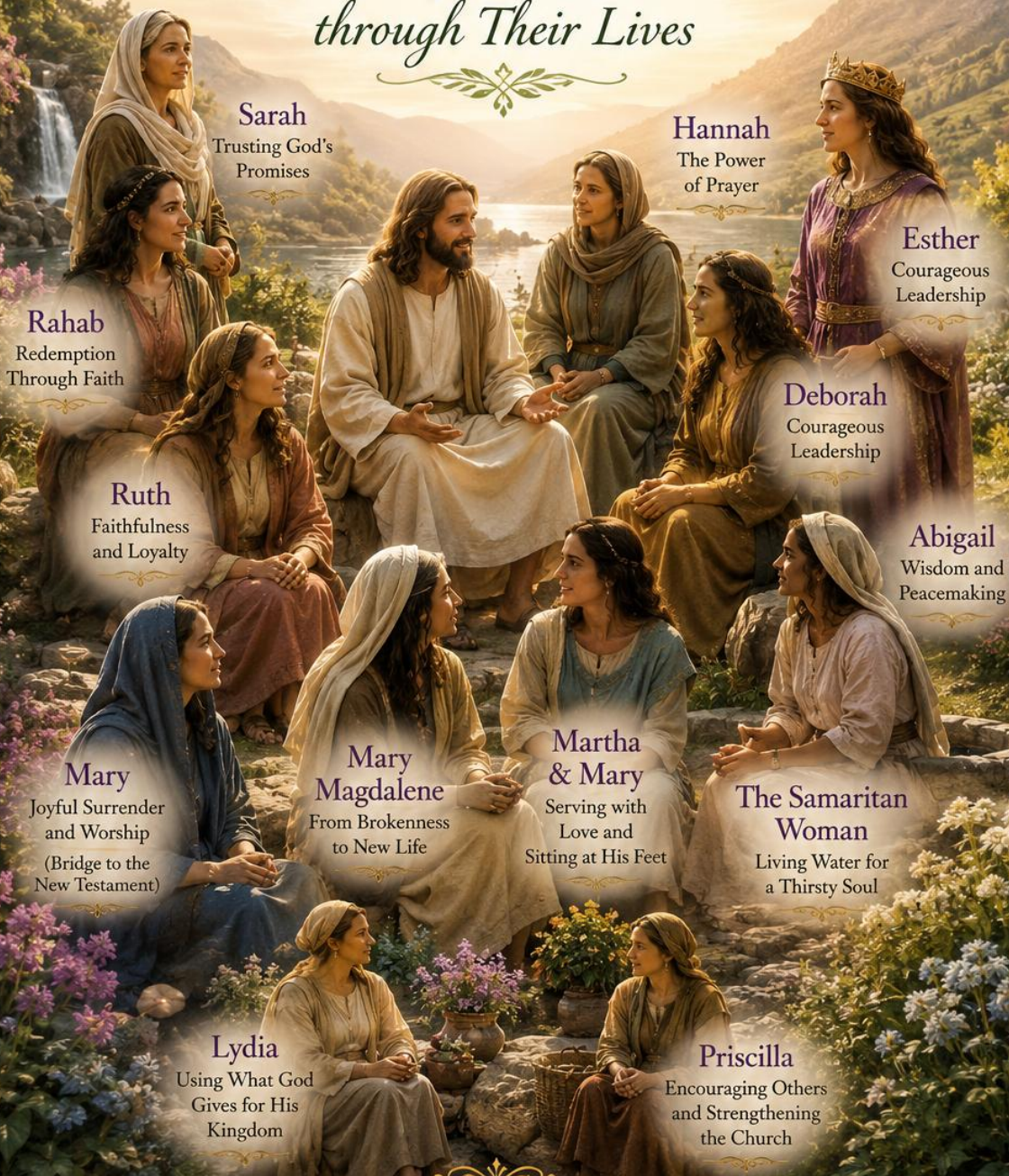

Discovering God's Character Through Their Lives

Introduction

Throughout my walk with Jesus Christ, God has continually drawn me back to one simple yet life-changing truth: the more we know God, the more we are transformed into His likeness. Throughout my doctoral studies, personal Bible study, seasons of healing, and years of ministry preparation, I have discovered that Scripture is not simply a collection of historical events or remarkable people. It is the unfolding story of God's **faithfulness** and His plan to redeem humanity through Jesus Christ.

This series was born out of that discovery. As I studied the lives of the **faithful** women God chose to include in His Word, I realized that each one reveals something beautiful about His character. Their stories are not recorded merely so we will admire their **faith, courage, wisdom, or devotion**. They are recorded so that we will know the God they trusted. Through their lives we see **His promises, His mercy, His provision, His wisdom, His power, His grace, and His unwavering faithfulness**. Every one of these women points us to Jesus Christ, who perfectly fulfills every promise and every truth revealed throughout Scripture.

These women lived in different generations and faced quite different circumstances. Some waited many years for God to fulfill **His promises**. Some carried painful pasts. Some endured seasons of grief and uncertainty. Others were called to lead courageously or to act wisely in tricky situations. Some experienced remarkable restoration after encountering Jesus. Yet despite their differences, they all share one common testimony: God is **faithful** to those who trust Him.

As you journey through these studies, you will meet **Sarah, Rahab, Ruth, Lydia, Deborah, Esther, Lydia, Mary the mother of Jesus, Mary Magdalene, Martha and Mary of Bethany, the Samaritan woman, Lydia, and Priscilla**. Together, their stories reveal the beautiful progression of God's redemptive plan—from His **covenant promises** in the Old Testament to their fulfillment in Jesus Christ, and then to the lives of women whose hearts were transformed by the gospel and who **faithfully** served His Kingdom. Each woman reveals another facet of God's character and another invitation for us to become more like Christ.

My prayer is that you will not approach these studies as biographies to be admired from a distance. Instead, invite the Holy Spirit to walk beside you through each chapter. Allow Him to search your heart, strengthen your **faith**, correct your thinking, and reveal areas where He desires to continue His transforming work within you. Ask Him not only to teach you about these women but also to teach you about Himself.

As you read each study, remember that the goal is not simply to learn more about **faithful women**. The goal is to know God more deeply, to recognize how every story points to Jesus Christ, and to allow His truth to shape your own life. Every lesson builds upon the previous one until together they reveal the beautiful picture God has been painting throughout all of Scripture—a picture of **His faithful love** and His desire to transform ordinary people into devoted followers of Christ.

As you read each woman's story, spend time reflecting on these questions before moving to the next study.

- What does this woman's life reveal about God's character?
- What qualities did God honor and develop in her life?

- *How does Jesus perfectly fulfill what I see in this woman's story?*
- *In what ways is the Holy Spirit calling me to become more like Christ?*
- *What practical step of faith or obedience is God asking me to take because of what I have learned?*
- *How can I reflect God's character more faithfully in my home, church, relationships, ministry, and community?*

As you prayerfully answer these questions throughout the series, you will begin to see that God is not only telling their story—He is continuing to write yours.

THEME

God opens willing hearts to receive the gospel, transforming lives and using faithful believers to advance His kingdom through generous service, hospitality, and obedient faith.

KEY TRUTH

Lydia's story reminds us that God is always at work preparing hearts to receive His truth. Though she was already seeking God, it was the Lord who opened her heart to fully understand and believe the message of Jesus Christ. Her immediate response of faith was demonstrated through baptism, generous hospitality, and a willingness to support God's work. Lydia teaches us that a heart surrendered to God willingly obeys His voice, uses its resources for His glory, and becomes a blessing to others as the gospel spreads.

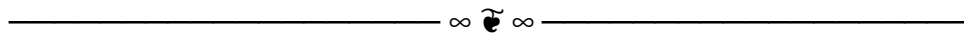
GOD'S CHARACTER REVEALED

- **God is Sovereign**—He prepares hearts and draws people to Himself according to His perfect plan.
- **God is Gracious**—He opens blind eyes to the truth of the gospel and offers salvation through Jesus Christ.
- **God is Personal**—He knows every seeking heart and meets each person at the right time with His truth.
- **God is Generous**—He blesses His people so they may become a blessing to others and support His kingdom.
- **God is Faithful**—He continues building His church through ordinary believers who respond in obedient faith.

- **God is Transforming**—He changes receptive hearts into faithful servants who impact their families, communities, and future generations.

CENTRAL LESSON

God delights in using hearts that are open and willing to follow Him. Lydia's life teaches us that when we respond to God's call with humble faith and joyful obedience, He transforms our lives into instruments for His kingdom. As He opens our hearts to His truth, He also opens our hands to serve others and our homes to advance the gospel, allowing our lives to become a testimony of His grace and faithfulness.



Lydia's Story

Lydia's story is found in Acts 16:11–15 and Acts 16:40, where she is introduced as a successful merchant from the city of Thyatira who sold expensive purple cloth. She was a worshiper of God who regularly gathered with others for prayer outside the city of Philippi. Although she sought to know God, it was during the apostle Paul's missionary journey that she heard the message of Jesus Christ and experienced true salvation.

As Paul shared the gospel, the Lord opened Lydia's heart to understand and believe the good news of Jesus Christ. She immediately responded in faith, and both she and her household were baptized as an outward expression of their new life in Christ. Lydia's conversion marked the beginning of the first known Christian church in Europe, making her one of the earliest believers on the continent.

After placing her faith in Christ, Lydia demonstrated the genuineness of her faith through generous hospitality. She warmly invited Paul and his companions to stay in her home, providing them with encouragement, support, and a place for ministry. Even after Paul and Silas were imprisoned and later released, they returned to Lydia's home to encourage the believers gathered there. Throughout her story, Lydia demonstrates that God delights in using willing hearts, faithful obedience, and generous service to advance His kingdom and strengthen His church.

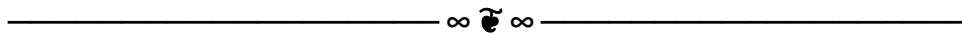


Understanding Lydia's World

Lydia lived during the first century in the Roman colony of Philippi, an important commercial city in Macedonia. Originally from Thyatira, a city well known for producing costly purple dye and fine textiles, Lydia had become a successful businesswoman. Purple cloth was considered a luxury item worn by royalty, government officials, and wealthy citizens, indicating that Lydia possessed both financial resources and influence within the community.

Although Philippi had very few Jewish residents, Lydia faithfully sought God by gathering with other worshipers at a place of prayer outside the city gate. Since there was no synagogue, this riverside gathering became the place where Paul first preached the gospel after God called him to Macedonia. Lydia's encounter with Paul reminds us that God sovereignly arranges circumstances so those who seek Him may hear the truth of Jesus Christ.

Hospitality held significant importance in the culture of the early church. Traveling missionaries often depended upon the generosity of believers for lodging, meals, and support. Lydia immediately opened both her heart and her home to God's servants, allowing her house to become a meeting place for the growing church in Philippi. Her willingness to use her resources for God's glory demonstrates how ordinary acts of faithfulness can have an extraordinary impact on the spread of the gospel.



What Lydia's Life Reveals About God

Lydia's life reveals a God who lovingly prepares hearts to receive His truth. Although Lydia already desired to worship God, it was the Lord Himself who opened her heart to understand and believe the gospel of Jesus Christ. Her salvation reminds us that faith is God's gracious work, drawing people to Himself through the power of His Word and His Holy Spirit.

Her story also reveals God's desire to use ordinary people in extraordinary ways. Most importantly, Lydia reminds us that a surrendered life becomes a powerful testimony of God's grace. Her quiet faithfulness helped establish one of the earliest Christian communities in Europe, proving that obedience often produces far-reaching results we may never fully see. As we faithfully offer our hearts and resources to God, He can accomplish far more through our lives than we could ever imagine.



Lydia's Life and My Journey

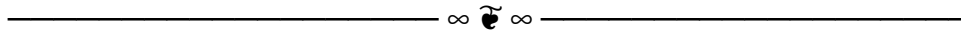

Grow Deeper

Digging Deeper

As you study the life of Lydia, look beyond the events of her story and focus on what they reveal about the character of God. Notice His grace in opening hearts to receive the gospel, His sovereignty in guiding Paul to Macedonia, and His faithfulness in building His church through willing servants. Observe how Lydia's open heart, generous hospitality, and obedient faith point us to Jesus Christ, who calls people to Himself and transforms their lives for His kingdom. Ask the Holy Spirit to show you how Lydia's journey applies to your own walk with the Lord and how God is inviting you to grow

in faith, respond with obedience, serve with generosity, and use what He has entrusted to you for His glory.

- **Hebrews 13:1–2** — Be encouraged to show hospitality and love to others as an expression of faith.
- **Philippians 1:3–6** — See Paul's love for the Philippian church and remember that God completes the good work He begins in His people.

These passages follow the same pattern as the other studies—beginning with Lydia's life in Acts and continuing with passages that reveal how her story points to Christ and encourages believers to live lives of open-hearted faith, willing obedience, generous hospitality, and faithful service.
